

### Deadlines

Applicants must apply both with the SOPHAS application for the MPH program and with the Bloomberg Fellows Program application.

For the applicant only: SOPHAS Application for the MPH Program and the Bloomberg Fellows Program

The priority application deadline for the required SOPHAS application for the MPH program and the Bloomberg Fellows Program is November 1, 2018. Complete applications received by this date will receive priority consideration. After the priority application deadline, the MPH program will continue to accept applications until the final deadline of December 1, 2018. Supplementary materials will not be accepted after the deadline.

For the applicant and the collaborating organization: The Bloomberg Fellows Program

The priority application deadline for the Bloomberg Fellows Program application is November 1, 2018. Complete applications (including both the student and organization portions) received by this date will receive priority consideration. After the priority deadline, the Bloomberg Fellows Program will continue to accept applications until the final deadline of December 1, 2018.

### Other Information

The Bloomberg Fellows Program and Scholarship is structured as a grant that converts to a loan if the terms are not met. Bloomberg Fellows will sign an Agreement that sets out these terms and conditions and includes an understanding of the payback requirement if the terms are not met. Applicants will be asked to sign this agreement after both admission into the MPH program and selection for the Bloomberg Fellows Program, but no later than April 15, 2019.

In addition, the organization will need to sign a letter of commitment to help assure there is an employment position for the Bloomberg Fellow after graduation for a time period of at least one year, beginning at the end of the Bloomberg Fellow's completion of the Program.

The letter will include an acknowledgment that failure to provide this position as promised (i) may affect the ability of the organization to have future staff participate in the Bloomberg Fellows program and (ii) may trigger an obligation on the part of the applicant to repay the grant.

The Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health has a long-standing commitment to recruiting, promoting and supporting a diverse student body. The School works diligently to promote a supportive environment that embraces the diverse cultures of our community. The School is also seeking diversity among collaborating organizations, including organizations that employ few individuals with formal public health training.
